

# Golf and Whiskey in Scotland

Day 01 Inverness airport arrive – A motor coach will be waiting at the airport for short transfer to the Nairn and the Best Western Hotel Windsor, a non smoking tourist class hotel with an excellent cuisine.



The hotel is only a few minutes from the Moray Firth and the down town area with some Pubs.

Dinner and overnight

Day 02 Drive to the golf course Fortrose and Rosemarkie for 18 holes. This hilly course, designed by James Braid is typical and unique, because the golf is more or less surrounded by the sea and offers a great view to the mountains. The first 8 holes are all along the sea.

## Day 03

A short drive (or even a walk) will take you to the golf championship golf course of Nairn for a round of 18 holes. Testis Traditional Scottish Golf Links course was created on the shores of the Moray Firth from a Highland wilderness of whines and heather, and tests the talents of professional and amateur alike. Founded in 1887, it is now one of the best courses in Scotland, and hosted the 1999 Walker Cup.



After the game you will be brought to the Cawdor Castle, dating from the 14<sup>th</sup> century with the fantastic gardens.

### Dinner and overnight

Day 04

This morning you will be brought to the golf course Elgin for a round of 18 holes. Founded in 1906, Elgin Golf Club is a testing heath land course measuring 6401 yards with a par of 69 and a standard scratch of 71, fully justifying its claim to be one of the finest inland courses in the northern part of Scotland. This course, a test to low and high handicap players alike, is always kept in immaculate condition by the green staff and, while playing one's round, there is the added beauty of the panoramic views - looking north over the city of Elgin, and to the south, the hills stretching to the distant Cairngorm Mountains.



After the game you will be brought to Glen for a visit of the Grant distillery & Gardens Rothes, founded in 1840.

Dinner and overnight

Day 05 A short drive will be bring you to the golf of Inverness for a round of 18 holes. This parkland course has some water hazards and requires accurate drives. Some of the holes are quite short and gives hope for a good score.



Afterwards you will continue south to Granton-on-Spey to the hotel Grant Arms – a tourist class hotel right in the centre of this small town and only a 5 minutes walk to the golf course.



Dinner and overnight

Day 06

This morning you drive for a round of 18 holes to the golf Boat of Garten. The warm, friendly welcome, the magnificent scenery, the clubhouse facilities, the bar and catering are all special at Boat of Garten but they are all added extras to the main feature - the course. You might have a poor game but you will be more than compensated for the splendid nature.



# Day 07

On foot you go to the golf of Granton-on-Spey for the last 18 holes of this magnificent week. A scramble tournament awaits you – bring a small gift for the winning teams. The Club was formed in 1890 and a nine hole course was laid out by A.C. Brown, a golf professional. In 1911 this was extended to 18 holes to a design by Willie Park, of Musselburgh. In 1921, James Braid was asked to advice on improvements to the course and the changes he recommended were incorporated and remain to the present day. Though not long, it presents a fair challenge for every calibre of golfer. It is naturally split into three distinct sections - Holes 1 to 6 are played over flat parkland, holes 7 to 12 through moderately hilly woodland, whilst holes 13 to 18 reverts to undulating parkland.

Day 08 Transfer from Granton-on-Spey to the Inverness airport in time for your return flight.
